Please join us as Penny Manson interviews Capitol Crimes member Baron Birtcher about his latest novel, *Reckoning*. The story follows Ty Dawson, a small-town sheriff with big-city problems, as he struggles to keep modernity at bay in rural Meriwether County. But a standoff between the federal government and cattlemen, a murdered Portland detective, and a swamp of corruption isn't making his life any easier.

Baron is the winner of the Silver Falchion Award (Hard Latitudes); Winner of Killer Nashville Readers Choice Award (South California Purples); and Best Book of the Year Award for Fistful Of Rain. He has also been nominated for the Nero Award, the Lefty, the Foreword Indie, the Claymore, and the Pacific Northwest's Spotted Owl Awards.

Baron's writing has been hailed as "The real deal" by Publishers Weekly; "Fast Paced and Engaging" by Booklist; and "Solid, Fluent and Thrilling" by Kirkus.

A theme is the ultimate message the author needs to get across to the reader. Ultimate, because generally, a work has a very singular message. There are also underlying messages to promote the singular. Author and teacher DJ Adamson will conduct a mini-workshop, discussing the value of considering themes before developing characters and plots. Writers (and readers) will learn how to discover themes, formulate them for their own work, and the value of how strong interlinking themes can create a more memorable story.

DJ's talk will include a PowerPoint presentation and handouts. Attendees are encouraged to apply concepts to their work-in-process during the workshop.

DJ Adamson has received awards for her Lillian Dove Mystery Series featuring amateur sleuth Lillian Dove. In addition, she was nominated in 2021 for a Clue Award for her Suspense Crime thriller Into the Storm. DJ is the editor of Le Coeur de l'Artiste, an online book review magazine, and interviews authors on her website blog, L'Artiste. 




