From the President

The art of revising.

After spending the better part of 18 months rewriting, editing and tinkering with my first manuscript, I could write the book on revising how *not* to do it.

Fortunately Capitol Crimes is bringing in a real expert this month — author and fellow SinC member from the Palmetto chapter <u>Carla Damron</u> — to help members polish their first drafts into shiny bestsellers.

Carla is the author of the Caleb Knowles mystery novels, a series featuring a social worker and his deaf brother, and draws from her own experience as a licensed clinical social worker and advocate.

In her new novel, THE ORCHID TATTOO, a social worker finds herself drawn into the human trafficking network when her sister vanishes. THE ORCHID TATTOO recently won the winter Pencraft Award for Literary Excellence.

She's also penned numerous short stories, essays and op-ed pieces.

You don't want to miss our June 17 Members Meeting with Carla, who will chat with us about how to revise your manuscript by offering techniques for moving the story forward, finding where the plot sags and how to use tension in every scene.

Capitol Crimes member <u>Karen A. Phillips</u>, who will be this month's Meet the Author guest, said beta readers helped her revise her debut mystery A DEADLY COMBO.

"I used four beta readers and each of them found something different to comment on. When all four gave me the same sage advice,

you bet I listened. That's when an author needs to pay attention and address those areas that give the reader pause," Karen said.

I finished the last round of revisions with my agent last week. As I type this, I'm preparing for a whole new circle of writing hell. But here are a few things I managed to learn:

- Be ruthless. Kill your darlings. (Or just put them in a coma, as someone at the Desert Sleuths <u>2021 WriteNow! Annual Conference</u> suggested instead.) Then carry on writing. Half my manuscript ended up in my "Unused Bits" file, and some of it made it back in.
- Make friends with Word Lady (or Word Guy) by using the "read aloud" function.
 I heard mistakes I'd read dozens of times, and awkward phrasing that made me cringe.
- You can tinker with your manuscript forever. Don't.

My long and winding revision journey also taught me better ways to plot and structure my next manuscript.

So I'm thinking Book 2 will go way smoother. Right?




LET YOUR STORY BLOOM THROUGH REVISION with Carla Damron

While creating a story comes from the magic of our imagination, revision requires our rational brain and our critical eye. In revision, we prune away the branches that go nowhere, the weeds that entangle our text, and the dead leaves that hinder growth. Revision is sacrifice and fine-tuning, but it is also the process of freeing the novel: letting it emerge into what it is meant to be.

Carla will offer specific techniques to answer the questions we must ask ourselves as we revise: what moves the story forward? Where does the plot sag? How can we make the narrative the best reading experience it can be? And most important of all: How do we use tension in every scene?
